GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS FOR EXHIBITORS

All farm and garden products must have been produced or harvested since the last fair, and only one exhibit of every variety from the same planting crop can be entered for premiums in its class.

Exhibitors need to follow the rules for the article they are entering in the different contests.

Awards will in no case be made when the exhibit is deemed (by the judges) to be unworthy of the premium.

When there is but one competitor in a class, the judges may award the first premium, if meritorious, but if not worthy of receiving the first premium, and in the opinion of the judges, the article may be worthy of second premium, then the judges must award only the second premium.

If the society should not receive money enough to pay premiums to exhibitors in full, they will be paid proportionally, according to what the society may receive. Any article receiving a cash premium at any previous fair of this Society is not entitled to any reward this year.

The association offers a liberal reward for the arrest and conviction of any person or persons apprehended in committing any malicious mischief or removing or purloining any articles left with the association for exhibition or otherwise

Authentic pedigrees of bloodstock of all kinds will be required, which must be filed with the secretary at time of entry. No animal will be allowed a premium unless sound. Health papers must be presented before animals are unloaded. No grade males are allowed.

No person shall be permitted in the judging ring except the judges, grooms, or persons in charge of the animals, officers of the association, and members of the press.

Articles on display, will be marked with tags, furnished by the secretary, designating the number of entry, and during the entire fair they must be placed entirely under the control of the officers of the association, and must in no case be removed before the close of the fair without special permission by the secretary or superintendent.

The managers will take every precaution for the safe keeping of animals and articles after arrival and arrangements for exhibition.

The association will not be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur. Exhibitors must give personal attention to their animals and articles, and at the close of the fair attend to their removal.

Exhibitors, when requested by superintendents of departments, are expected to make verbal or written statements concerning their contributions. Refusal to comply with such a request may bar the exhibit from premium.

Judges examining animals and articles are requested to report their awards to the secretary and to him only, until after the award of premiums is published.

NOVELTIES

Any person having novelties of any kind that would prove instructive or interesting will confer a favor on the society by presenting them for exhibition. This applies to all departments

INSTRUCTIONS FOR LIVETOCK EXHIBITORS

General Rules and Regulations

No dogs will be allowed on the fairgrounds with the exception of registered service dogs.

Livestock entries must be approved by the Livestock Superintendent. All entries must be received by the Livestock Superintendent by the second Saturday in August. Entries received after the second Saturday of August will be declined. No telephone entries will be accepted.

All animals must be entered under the owner's name on the Livestock Entry Form. No substitutions will be allowed. Entries are limited as described in the individual species classes and as space allows on a first-come, first serve basis. Exhibitors are limited to one entry form per species. See individual species pages for class registration information.

If any exhibitor must cancel or withdraw, they must contact the Livestock Superintendent as soon as possible.

Sawdust and/or shavings will be provided for bedding. Quality hay may be purchased on the grounds. To ensure enough hay is available, please indicate on your entry form how many bales are needed.

Stalls and pens may not be used for sleeping or storage. If space allows, the Livestock Superintendent may grant space for a tack stall.

There are no stalling fees.

All stock must be on the fairgrounds by 9:00 AM on Friday; sheep must be in place by 4:00 PM on Thursday.

Animals competing for group premiums must also be entered for single premiums. At the time of entry, or on request of fair officials, all livestock entered as purebred must show a registration certificate issued by the breed association, in the owner's name

The age of each animal, unless otherwise specified, shall be determined as of July 1 of the current year.

No grade males are allowed on the premises.

Fair management reserves the right to accept or reject any entry made. Fair management further reserves the right to interpret any rule or statement made in this book.

No interference with any judges, State Veterinarian or State Official while these persons are discharging their duties. Any abusive language by the exhibitor or their attendants shall make these exhibitors liable to be suspended from the privileges of this Fair, livestock show, or exhibition by the livestock Superintendent, Fair Management or Show Committee and forfeiture of all prize money.

Animal Health Requirements

- 1. No brucellosis or tuberculin test is required for cattle and goats in the State of Maine if they originate directly from herds within the State, not under quarantine.
- 2. Domestic animals offered for show or exhibition at any fair or livestock show or exhibition, showing evidence of external parasites, foot rot, shipping fever, or other diseases* may be excluded from exhibition, isolated, ordered from the Fairgrounds, or otherwise handled as the Director of the Division of Animal Industry may direct.
- *Ringworm and warts are classified as infectious diseases.
- 3. All domestic animals originating outside the State of Maine must meet the same requirements to show as are required for entry into the State.
- 4. All horses must have a negative Coggins Test Certificate (Equine Infectious Anemia), 6 months for out of state residents and 36 months for Maine residents
- 5. The Maine Fair Superintendents have recommended that all animals should be vaccinated against I.B.R, P.I.3, and B.V.D. This is not required.

Premiums

See individual livestock show pages for registration information and premiums.

The premiums listed in this book are under the approval of the Board of Directors. Changes and awards not described herein will not be made without their consent.

A prize of \$100 will be awarded for the birth of any large animal (sheep, goats, cattle, llamas, alpacas) on exhibition at the Fair.

Herdsmen's and Shepherd's Awards

All exhibitors will be automatically entered into the herdsman's/shepherd's award in. Awards will be given for outstanding herdsman/shepherd in each class. Exhibitors will be divided into "small" and "large" herds at the Livestock Superintendent's discretion. Prizes will be awarded to the first four places in each class/herd size.

Trophy & \$30, Rosette & \$20, \$15, \$10

Livestock Department Camping

Livestock camping entries must be submitted to the Livestock Superintendent along with livestock exhibit entries by the second Saturday in August. See Livestock Entry form. There is a fee of \$25 for camper sites. Camper fees not received in advance will be due to the Livestock Superintendent before any payment of earned premiums will be made.

Tent sites may be available at the discretion of the livestock superintendent. There is no fee for tents

Camper and tent sites will not be made available in the livestock department to anyone who is not exhibiting livestock or assisting a livestock exhibitor at the fair.

Camper sites are 12' wide. Campers with slide outs/awnings which extend beyond 12' when deployed must rent 2 sites, if available. Exhibitors wishing to park their livestock trailer inside the livestock area for use as a camper and/or storage must pay for a camper site or sites. Livestock trailer parking is available outside of the livestock area at no charge. Exhibitors with campers or tents must check in with the livestock office prior to setting up. Those who set up without checking in may be required to move.

Power supply is limited and may not allow for the running of air conditioners and other high-draw electronics. The Livestock Superintendent reserves the right to require reduced power usage in campers at any time.

Livestock Department Parking and Fair Passes

Exhibitors may request up to two livestock area parking passes per livestock entry form.

Exhibitors may request **one** additional livestock area parking pass per camper site.

All other vehicles must be parked outside the gate in designated parking areas.

Walk-in passes: Exhibitors may request up to 4 5-day passes and 4 one-day passes per livestock entry form.

Additional passes may be available at the Livestock Superintendent's discretion.

4-H LIVESTOCK EXHIBITS

General Rules

Competition is open to all Maine 4-H members age 9 and older. Each exhibit must meet the requirements of a 4-H project, except for Cloverbuds.

All animals must meet 4-H rules below as well as the entry, residence, health and other requirements listed in the "Instructions for Livestock Exhibitors" section. Animals must be owned/leased and registered in the name of the 4-H member by June 30. (See individual sections for exceptions.)

- 4-H exhibitors must wear clothing in accordance with the following dress code while showing in 4-H livestock shows:
 - Shirts Solid or western style button-down or solid color polostyle, tucked in.
 - Pants Solid color work/dress pants or nice blue jeans. Must wear a belt.
 - Footwear Closed toe work or western boots. No sneakers, sandals, clogs, or Crocs.
 - All attire should be in good repair, free from holes and with no lettering or logos except 4-H.

At the discretion of the Livestock Superintendent 4-H exhibitors not following the dress code above may be allowed to show, but are not eligible for blue ribbons or first place in showmanship and fitting.

Rules and Regulations for 4-H Animal Shows at Maine Agricultural Fairs

1. "4-H Age" is defined as the age of the 4-H member as of December 31 of the current 4-H year. All ages below are "4-H Ages."

- 4-H exhibitors must be 9 through 18 years of age in order to show competitively in any 4-H animal show.
- 4-H members age 8 may participate in non-competitive demonstration shows using a kid goat, non-market lamb, or non-market calf. One-on-one supervision by an adult or older teen is required. All participants will receive identical forms of recognition of participation.
- All shows will require that exhibitors ages 9 through 18 present the standard Approval Form for 4-H Animal Shows
- 3. Each animal must be listed on only one member's approval form.
- Since animal approval forms document animal projects, Cloverbud members will not be required to use Animal Approval Forms for their animal activities.
- 5. 4-H members ages 9 through 18 must fit any animals they show. Members ages 5 through 8 may assist an adult or older 4-H member in fitting their animal with the amount of hands-on participation related to the skills and abilities of the younger member.
- 6. 4-H members 9 through 18 may use leased animals in 4-H shows.
- 7. An Animal Substitution Form is available for a 4-H member to use if their ONLY project animal listed on the current year's signed and embossed official Animal Approval Form dies, or has a long-term critical illness that will affect the animal's ability to show and warrant it "unusable" in the current 4-H year. In both cases this must be confirmed by a licensed veterinarian with both a signature on the Animal Substitution Form and a certificate of death, or written statement of long-term illness that will affect the animal's ability to

show in the current 4-H year. If one of a 4-H member's animals is unable to be exhibited for any reason (illness, death), and they have other project animals listed on their Animal Approval form there is never any substitution form allowed.

Judging and Premiums

All 4-H shows will be judged using the Danish system unless otherwise noted. The Danish system is a method of evaluation where a product or process is evaluated against a set of standards, and recognition is awarded on the degree to which the standard has been met by each competitor. In Danish system judging, the exhibitors are not judged against each other. In a "true" Danish system the standard of excellence is the same for everyone regardless of age or experience. In 4-H, a "modified" Danish system is used that uses standards adjusted according to member's age and years of experience in the project. The Danish system is used in 4-H for 9 through 19 year olds because it is a way to provide recognition to greater numbers of youth who may all be making significant progress in their projects. The Danish system is considered by National 4-H Policy to be a competitive form of judging and is therefore not to be used for 4-H members under the age of 9.

Ribbons awarded under the Danish system are:

- **Blue:** for excellence, exceeding the standards
- Red: for good work that meets the expected standard
- White: for work that falls below the expected standard

Showmanship & Fitting Awards

Competition will be held in all 4-H Livestock Shows in the following categories:

SENIOR: Ages 14-19 JUNIOR: Ages 9-13

NOVICE: First year showing, ages 9-19 INTERMEDIATE may be added at the discretion of the Livestock Superintendent

Premiums for each category above:

1st place - Trophy & \$25 2nd Place - Rosette & \$20 3rd Place - Rosette & \$15

A \$5 gratuity paid to all non-placing participants.

Non-premium ribbons will be awarded using the Danish system.

Cloverbuds will receive a participation ribbon.

4 - H SHEEP

All animals (except Market Lambs) must have registration papers issued in the member's name. Limit of 2 sheep per individual class. Limit 1 entry per exhibitor for groups. All animals entered in groups must be entered in single classes, where applicable.

Danish Ribbon Premiums: Blue - \$13, Red - \$12, White - \$11

4-H HANDSPINNER'S CLASS

(Animal approval forms required)

This show is for judging fleece only. Sheep may be any age, purebred or crossbred, ewes or wethers. The judge may choose to divide the class at their discretion.

Judging will include, but is not limited to cleanliness of fleece and appropriate grooming and fitting for the breed. Trophy for the best fleece with ribbons awarded according to the Danish system.

Sheep must be owned by the exhibitor. Limit 2 entries per exhibitor. Exhibitors with 2 sheep may have a second 4-H handler assist them.

MERRITT AVERILL 4-H SHEEP LEAD LINE CLASS

Sheep should be owned and part of a 4-H member's project. Purebred or market lamb, led on a halter. Garment must be made of 70% wool and preferably homemade. Garment should be of a practical nature. Contestants will submit a written commentary to the Livestock Superintendent at least 30 minutes before the show.

Point System

- 40 Outfit
- 25 Fitting and appearance of the sheep
- 25 Handling and control of the sheep
- 10 Contestant's appearance and poise
- 10 extra points if the garment was made by the contestant.

Trophy & Rosette

Market Lamb - 60 pounds minimum, any breed, registered or grade, ewes or wethers.

1st Place Trophy & Rosette Special Premiums for 1st, 2nd, 3rd \$20 \$15 \$10

4-H BEEF CATTLE

Any animals are acceptable as long as they show beef characteristics. Steers and heifers may be grade or purebred. Purebred animals must be registered in the owner's name. Limit 1 entry per class per exhibitor.

Animals must have been owned or leased by June 1 of this year and must be registered with the project leader by that date.

All breeds of heifers will be judged together.







RAZOR CROSMAN SPORTSMANSHIP AWARD

Selected by three judges who work independently and are unknown to each other as far as being judges for this event. The judges are people who are not strangers to the Barn, 4-H Exhibit Hall, Show Ring, and other 4-H areas. These judges go through the area several times during the fair and do so usually unobserved.

They look for clean stalls, pens, and animals that are being taken care of by the 4-H member

The 4-H member should always be willing to greet people and answer any question they may have.

The judges check to see who is willing to help another 4-H member with their chores.

The 4-H Exhibit Hall is checked to see who has projects on display.

The 4-H steer ticket sales area and food booth areas are also checked.



The Danish System

The Danish System, requires that each competitor be compared to a predetermined standard of excellence and awarded a blue, red, or white ribbon based on those standards. In the Danish System, exhibitors within a class are never compared to one another as they are judged under the standard ranking system. Since participants are judged against a set of criteria on an individual basis, not against other participants, it is possible for each participant in a class to earn a blue ribbon. A "First Blue" ribbon is awarded to the best of the blue ribbon winners.

Blue Ribbon - Outstanding or Excellent Work. The exhibitor has met and/or exceeded basic requirements of the class. One or two minor faults, if immediately corrected, do not eliminate an exhibitor from the blue ribbon category.

Red Ribbon - Good Work. An exhibitor completed the required work but with an accumulation of faults; missed leads, broken gaits, excessive speed, lack of coordination, poor equitation, poor grooming, or dirty or poor fitting tack.

White Ribbon - Needs Improvement. An exhibitor completed the class but with some major faults or broken patterns; inability to execute and maintain required gait or performing in wrong lead without attempting to correct it.
